### So what's all this about bonus points?

St Ives has gained a noteworthy and important 20 bonus points so far this season. It is not yet a record for a Cornish side, (or any team in the south west), but it could be with five games still to be played. The bonus point system of a point for scoring four or more tries and a point for not losing by more than 7pts was first introduced at national league level in 2006-07. At the time St Ives were in South West 1 and achieved 23pts from 22 games; W11 D1 L10.

It was not until 2010-11 that the system was adopted across all leagues. Very few teams outside the top two gain the most in any one season. Cambridge created a record of 25BP from 29 games, when finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in NL1 (2010-11).

In 2013-14 Hartbury College won NL2 (South) with 25BPfrom 26 matches. The record in Western Counties West is 24pts set by lvybridge when they won the league in 2013-14.
